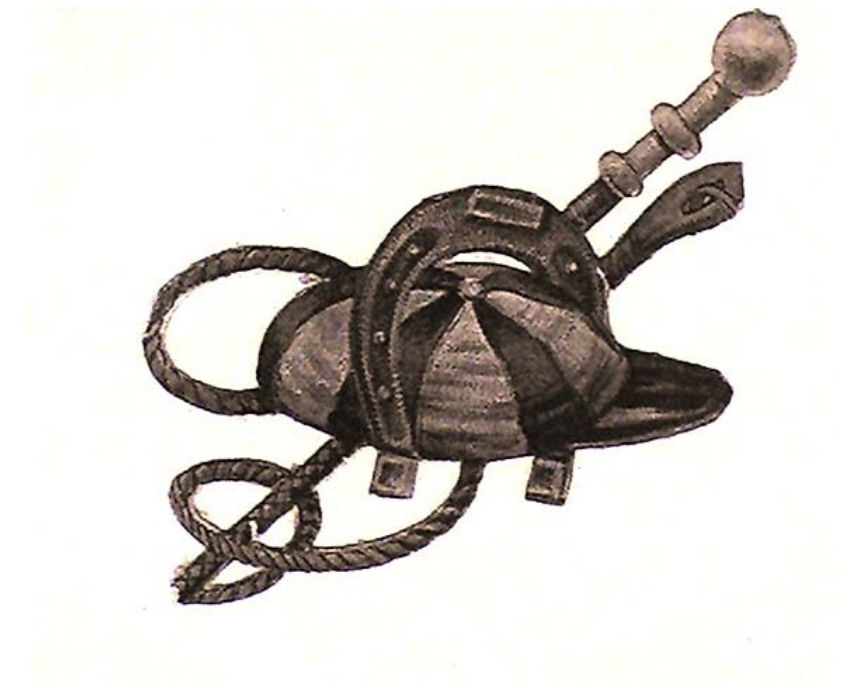

Class 700. Eaton Equestrian Centre Hunter Derby

The Eaton Equestrian Centre Hunter Derby is modeled after the USHJA Hunter Derby that is held at top competitions throughout the country.

A goal of the Hunter Derby is to bring the basic principles of riding back into show hunters through the use of challenging courses, interesting jump materials and greater variation in fence construction. (www.ushja.org)

The class will run with a 2 round format. Riders must declare fence height 1 hour prior to class. Riders must ride same fence height for both rounds.

The first round is a Hunter Classic Course, 10 jumps minimum, Fence heights are 2'6"-2'9" or 3'0"-3'2". The course will have at least one in and out, at least one bending line and at least one line with an unrelated distance. See below for description of fences

The second round is a Handy Hunter Course, 6 jumps minimum. Fence heights are same as round one. The course must have a minimum of 2 of the following options: trot jump, open gate while mounted, lead over a jump, tight turn option, clever options for jump approaches, halt and/or back, walk a jump.

At least 2 fences in the courses will be set above stated fence heights as option jumps. Jumps will simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field, and the course should offer a variety of jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage and straw. A 3" difference is required for the back element of an obstacle, and for appropriate jumps, no ground line is acceptable.

The class format shall be as follows: Round 1 Classic Hunter Course 3'0"-3'2" . Round 1 Classic Hunter Course 2'6"-2'9". Award winners for each fence height in round 1. Round 2 Handy Hunter Course 2'6"-2'9". Round 2 Handy Hunter Course 3'0"-3'2". Award winners for each fence height in Round 2. Overall Champion and Reserve for combined scores for Round 1 and Round 2 for 2'6"-2'9" and 3'0"-3'2". Victory Gallop.

The Champion of each fence height will receive a monogrammed cooler, and the reserve champion will receive a prize as well. Each round at each fence height, will be pinned, ribbons 1st-10th.

ROBERTSON MEDAL

Open to junior and amateur riders on horses. To be shown over an advanced equitation course 2'9" in height. Emphasis will be put on riding style, technique and accuracy.

In the first round, riders will ride over a course of at least 8 obstacles. The top 8 riders from the over fence round will return to work on the flat. The under saddle performance of those selected to show under saddle will count 50%. The top four riders will do a test of the judge's choice. Tests 1-19. Ribbons through 8th place will be awarded. Champion of the Robertson Medal to receive a monogrammed cooler donated by Sigrun Robertson.

HORSE SHOW RULES

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VALUTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES PROVIDED THE RESPECTIVE BREED/DISCIPLINE DUES OR BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE HAS BEEN PAID. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS, AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$20 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE, AND \$5 BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE FOR EACH BREED/DISCIPLINE.

PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1)LEADLINE; 2)EXHIBITIONS; 3)GAMES AND RACES; 4)CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS AND 5)WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM), 6. USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS;PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPTITIONS; 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES. 9)CITIZENS OFOTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone any class due to unforeseen weather conditions judged to be hazardous or detrimental to the safely and general welfare of the participants, mounts and/or facilities. The right is also reserved to combine or change the order of classes and to refuse to return any entry fee before of during the show without being liable for compensation. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all question and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All question not covered in these Rules shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith except where specifically overridden by the rules and specifications of the Alaska State Horsemen, Inc.

This entry shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that the person entering this horse show as rider or owner hold harmless the competition officials, directors and other agents for any injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials: will abide by the local rules of the competition.

HORSE/PONY NOMINATION

For 2008 we will continue to use the nomination procedure. When entries are sent in, the payment is for stall fees and a horse/pony nomination. Classes thought to enter are also listed. Then upon check in and throughout the show, exhibitors may add/ scratch/change any classes listed on their entry form at no charge as long as it is done prior to 4:00pm the day before the class.

Example 1: entered Open Working Hunter. Realized that open was too high and wanted to ride in Low instead. Change upon check in for no charge.

Example 2: Want to add Level 0 on Friday. If added prior to 4:00 on Thursday, there is no charge, if added after 4:00 p.m. on Thursday \$5 office fee.

Example 3: Want to scratch Level 0 on Friday. If scratched prior to 4:00 on Thursday, you will not be charged the entry fee for Level 0, if scratch on Friday, or Thursday after 4:00 you will be charged the entry fee.

This allows riders and trainers to enter on a day by day basis. If add/scratches/changes are done prior to 4:00 p.m. the day before there is no charge AND entry fees for scratched classes will be refunded. Exhibitors must clear their show bill by the end of the show, if not, the check lodged with the secretary will be filled out in the amount shown with no disputes allowed.

ENTRY PROCEDURE

ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY: 6:00 P.M. AUGUST 6TH

For each horse/pony entered in the open horse show, send a \$50 nomination fee and the stall fee (if a stall is needed) along with your completed entry blank. Then bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show.

NUMBERS WILL NOT BE ISSUED WITHOUT A CHECK COVERING THE BALANCE OF THE ENTRIES. (A signed, open check is preferred.) Upon check in, entries will have the opportunity to add/scratch any classes listed on their entry form at no cost.

1. The following fees for each horse must accompany the entry form:
 - a) All stall and tack room fees
 - b) Horse/Pony Nomination \$50
 - c) If entering the Beginner/Novice Classes and/or Hunter Performance and/or Walk/Trot Equitation and/or Pleasure Horse 1st Year Green ONLY please send in stall fees and classes. No horse/pony nomination is necessary.
2. The entry form for each horse must include:
 - a) Horse name and complete description
 - b) All classes or divisions entered..
 - c) All mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibitor
 - d) Copies of membership cards for USEF, USHJA and ASH

POST ENTRIES

An entry that has not been received by the horse show office will be considered a post entry. These entries will pay the regular class fees plus the penalties stated below. The following situations will constitute a post entry and will be charged as stated:

1. Entries received after the closing date for the show will pay a penalty fee of \$35.

2. New entries made after the show starts will pay a penalty of \$50.

ADDS/SCRATCHES/CHANGES

Adds/Scratches/Changes are made on an entry that has been received by the horse show office. The penalties will only apply if done after 4:00 p.m. the day preceding the class. Any add/scratch/change made in the Horse Show Office on the Official Form will be charged as follows, if done after 4:00 p.m. the preceding day.

1. Add a class→penalty of \$5
2. Change from one class to another→penalty of \$5
3. Change of horse in and equitation class/change of rider in a performance class→no charge
4. Scratching a class after 4:00 p.m. the day before will not receive entry fees back.

Any scratch made in the Horse Show office and accompanied by a licensed equine vet's Certificate will be charged a penalty of \$50. Only entry fees will be refunded.

SUBSTITUTIONS

A new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse for a fee of \$50

REFUNDS

Full refunds of the entry fees may be refunded before the horse show. After the show starts, with a licensed equine vet's certificate only, full refund will be given minus a \$50 scratch fee and fees for classes already held prior to notification of the Horse Show Secretary, whether exhibited in or not. Scratches must be made in the Horse Show Office prior to the conclusion of the horse show. Refunds will be mailed within 30 days of the close of the show. Stabling and nomination fees will not be refunded.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

A current (within 6 months) negative EIA must be included with entries.

STABLING

Weekly stabling is provided. Stalls have a bottom door with some having full doors.. Stabling will be available from Noon Tuesday 8/12 through 8 p.m. Sunday 8/17 for \$100. For entrants in the beginner novice show, stabling will be available from 10 a.m. Fri 8/15 through 8p.m. Sun 8/17 for \$45. Daily stabling is not available. Stall assignments will be based upon arrival on the show grounds, first come first serve.

FOOTING/ARENA

Both arenas and schooling areas are sand/pea gravel. Arenas are 140X200.

NON NEGOTIABLE CHECKS

Checks returned by the bank for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$50. Upon notification of a returned check, accounts will be given three days to make full payment, including the penalty, which must be paid in certified funds, cashier's check or money order.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitting protective headgear when jumping on the show grounds. Additionally, all juniors must wear properly fitting ASTM approved protective headgear with harness secured and properly fitted while riding in the designated schooling and exercise areas, the show ring and while jumping anywhere on the show grounds.

FOOD

Food service will be available on the grounds.

MINOR EXHIBITORS

Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. NO child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless the entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian.

DRUG FEES

USEF Federation Fee \$12.00 (\$7.00 Drugs and Medication, \$5.00 USEF)

AMATEUR STATUS

Adults showing in Adult Amateur/Amateur hunter or jumper classes must be Amateur Senior or Life Members of the USEF or Affiliate Members of the USEF. Non members of USEF must be in possession of USEF Amateur Certification

MEASUREMENT CARDS

All horses/ponies showing in the Junior Hunter Division/Pony Hunter Division must be in possession of an USEF measurement card or a copy of a valid measurement form, and same (in its original form) must be presented to the Horse Show Secretary. Numbers WILL NOT be issued before the above requirements have been complied with.

VETERINARIAN/FARRIER

The veterinarian and farrier for the show are on call. Their respective phone numbers will be posted at the Horse Show Office.

JUMPING ORDER

Please see class list for classes with open cards and classes with posted order.

SCHOOLING

The show arenas will be open for schooling according to the class list. Ring 1 and Ring 2 will be open on Wednesday for schooling from 10:00 to 5:00.

LUNGING

The south schooling area will be reserved for lunging. This is the only area in which horses are to be lunged. Riders may use the south schooling area, but lunging horses have priority. Please see the class list for when the lunging area is closed.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

ALL championships and reserves will be awarded according to USEF Chapter VII, Article 333.6. Ties in equitation will be broken by the most points earned over fences. Ties in Jumper will remain tied.

ARENA ETIQUETTE

While the arenas are open for schooling on the flat and/or over fences, show management reserves the right to ask horses/riders/trainers to leave the arenas if their schooling is disrupting the horse show. Fences may be lowered/raised, HOWEVER THEY MAY NOT BE MOVED, AND PANELS/FLOWERS/ETC. MAY NOT BE ADDED AND/OR REMOVED. Horses and/or unauthorized persons are not permitted in arenas when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class. VIOLATIONS of any of the above will be considered cause for elimination from the show and/or a \$100 fine.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be divided 50%, 30%, 20% in all "B" rated classes. The owner of any horse/pony exhibited in classes where prize money is awarded MUST provide a Social Security number before prize money will be paid. Prize money checks will be made out to the prize money recipient recorded on the entry blank and will be mailed or hand-delivered within 30 days after the show. Prize money will only be awarded if there are three entrants in the class.

MISC. FEES

A \$25.00 Grounds Fee per day will be assessed to horses and ponies under the following circumstances. 1. Horses not entered in any classes at the horse show, whether stabled or not, but using the facility. 2. Non-stabled horses and ponies will pay a \$25.00 per horse/pony per day participating at the horse show, except entrants in Walk/Trot, Hunter Performance, Pleasure Horse 1st year green, and the Beginner/Novice classes. This fee helps to cover the cost of rental of the facility.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR ALL HUNTER CLASSES

Entry Fees

"B" rated sections are \$120, Individual "B" classes are \$30, except Pony Hunter is \$90 for the section.

All other sections may be entered for \$100, Individual Classes are \$25. Hunter Performance Division and Pleasure Horse 1st Year Green are \$20.

Hunter Over Fences

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

Hunter Under Saddle

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. May be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge but no more than eight to gallop at one time. Except Green Working Hunter, Long and Short Stirrup Hunter. Martingales not permitted.

In order to be eligible for the under saddle class, one must complete at least one course over fences in the respective division at the same show.

Champion and Reserve Champion

To be awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle. Champion and Reserve Champion to receive ribbons, with the Champion receiving a sponsored award.

Courses

Hunter courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, coop, and panels. *The area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a mandatory line and will be indicated on the course diagram, as well as a corresponding barrier erected on course.* Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads as competition warrants.

In Handy classes obstacles must simulate those found in trappy hunting country. The course must have at least two changes of direction and at least one combination. Horses may be required to trot over one obstacle toward the end of the course, may be asked to lead over one obstacle or open a gate while mounted.

Jogging

Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. The following constitute major faults and may be cause for elimination: 1) refusal 2)loss of stirrup 3)trotting while on course and when not part of a test and 4)loss of reins. Each contestant may circle once if desired before approaching the first jump. He or she may then proceed around the course keeping an even hunting pace. Any of all contestants may be called back to perform at the walk, trot and canter, or to execute any appropriate tests, held and judged in accordance with USEF Rule XXII, Article 2213.

UNDER SADDLE
